



Getting Healthcare Under the New ID Law

Starting August 1, 2009, most healthcare providers (doctors, hospitals, walk-in clinics, etc.) will require proof of identification (ID) before being treated. This is part of a new Federal law aimed at preventing identity theft

When you come to any Albemarle Health location for care, you must bring the following:

1 "Picture ID" AND 1 "Insurance Card" OR 1 "Picture ID" AND 2 "Other IDs"

Picture ID (need 1)

- Driver's license
- Passport
- State ID card
- Military ID
- Work ID card
- ID from NCDC

Other ID (need Insurance Card or 2 of these)

- Social Security Card
- Birth certificate
- Utility bill (electric, gas, phone, cable, or water)
- Tax bill or statement
- W2 or Income tax return
- Credit card
- ATM card
- Library card
- Voter registration card
- Apartment lease
- School record signed by Principal
- Insurance policy (life, health, property, or auto)
- Letter from homeless shelter
- Computer printed check stub

Remember ...

- If your "Picture ID" has an old address on it, you must bring an extra "Other ID" that shows your correct address.
- For a child under 18 to get treatment, we must have proof of ID for their parent or guardian (see above).
- If you have not been to one of our locations for more than 3 months, you will need to bring proof of ID again.

You will need ...

1 "Proof of Residency" AND 1 "Proof of Age and Identity" AND 1 Social Security Card

OR

1 "Proof of Residency" AND 1 "Proof of Age and Identity" AND document from U.S. Government showing you are in the U.S.A. legally

Proof of Residency (need 1)

- NC driver's license
- Passport
- Military orders or letter from Veterans Administration
- INS documents
- Matricula Consular from Government of Mexico
- Letter from Social Security
- Property tax statement
- Library card
- Voter registration card
- Apartment lease
- Utility bill (electric, gas, phone, cable, or water)
- School record signed by Principal
- Insurance policy (life, health, property, or auto)
- Letter from homeless shelter
- Computer printed check stub

Proof of Age and Identity (need 1)

- Driver's license or State ID from another state
- Passport
- Military ID
- Certified Birth Certificate
- NC School Registration record signed by school official
- Report of Consular Birth Abroad

- Close any accounts in your name that someone else might have opened
- File a report with the police
- Report it to the Federal Trade Commission, at ftc.gov/idtheft, or call 1-877-438-4338
